Alumni Spotlight: Adam Zucker (1984)



Brother Master Adam Zucker, graduated from the University of Delaware in December 1984. He then received his Juris Doctor at Delaware Law School in 1988. Currently, he lives in Blue Bell, PA with his wife, Tamson Zucker, whom he met during college. They have a daughter, Rachel. Who is a current Honors Business student at Delaware. Brother Zucker is a partner in the law firm of Mudrick & Zucker, P.C., in Conshohocken, Pennsylvania where he focuses on Criminal Defense and Title IX defense advising.

Additionally, Past Master Zucker is an elected township supervisor in Whitpain Township. He is the former president of the Montgomery County Trial Lawyers, and a past member of the board of directors of the Montgomery Bar Association.

He is an instrument rated private pilot and enjoys flying his Beechcraft Bonanza to visit friends and family in New England, Michigan and several other locations. He has used his passion for flying to pursue charitable endeavors and is a past president of Angel Flight East, an organization which coordinates flights in private aircraft for people who need medical treatment far from home. Additionally, he has been a bone marrow donor through Be The Match Program and serves on his synagogue's board of directors.

He has remained close to his AEPi brothers and has stayed active in AEPi since graduating by serving various roles, including advisor at the Temple University chapter. He has spoken at numerous chapters along the East Coast and at conclaves about Title IX issues. Furthermore, Brother Zucker educates undergraduate brothers on Title IX issues and how to avoid and deal with Title IX complaints if they are filed. His accomplishments include also speaking at AEPi regional alumni gatherings on networking and organizing the annual Rho Deuteron tailgate with alumni Brother Steven Weichert (88'). Currently, he is writing a risk management education program for undergraduate chapters with other national alumni. 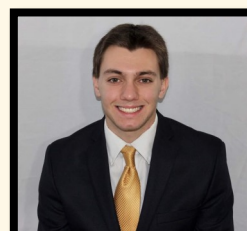
