There have been a lot of changes to the Phi Gamma chapter of AEPi. Whether you graduated five, ten, or fifty years ago, this chapter has changed and improved in a number of ways since then.

We are one of the largest AEPi chapters in the world, and our brotherhood is one of the largest on the UF campus. We now have over 100 active brothers, in addition to 52 members of the fall 2012 pledge class. Our beautiful, new fraternity house was opened just three years ago on our original lot at 14 Fraternity Row, and it has been a huge asset as we've built up our brotherhood since its opening.

Our most exciting recent achievement was this year's fall rush. Our Rush Chair Harry Dobkin did an amazing job over this past summer and the beginning of the fall semester, and we recruited the largest pledge class of any fraternity in the IFC with 52 new members. This was an amazing accomplishment for our chapter, which will allow us to continue our growth in many ways.
