There are four Brothers that will be graduating this semester in December, all with Honors distinctions (tentatively!).

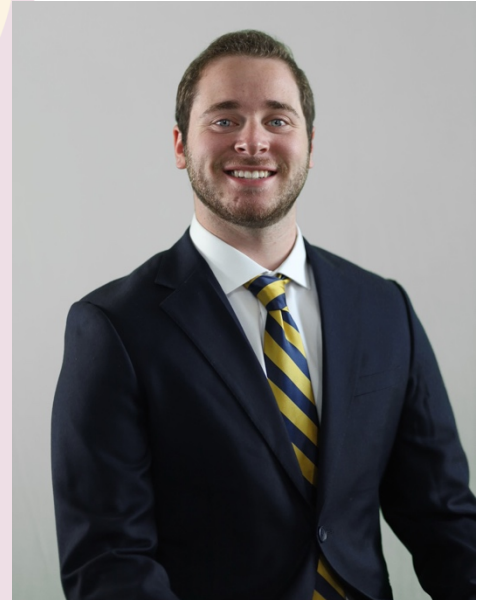
